As 2018 draws to a close, I want to take this opportunity to extend a heartfelt thank you to all who served on the Steering Committee for your dedication to furthering the mission of IEEE SIGHT. There were many of you, including the team on the Interim Committee early in 2018 as well as the 2018 Committee members. Many Steering Committee members received valuable support from members of their own Subcommittees.

Through the leadership of the Steering Committee, SIGHT was able to approve 24 new group petitions from 14 countries, welcome 3,985 new members, review 50 project proposals from 24 countries, and fund 10

sustainable development projects to impact underserved communities around the world. Each group, member, proposal, and project represent numerous hours of work for our Steering Committee, and their efforts have empowered many others to achieve success. On behalf of IEEE staff, volunteers, and individuals whose lives have been changed through SIGHT - thank you!

Most of you know that the team members I thanked relied on IEEE staff in essential ways. Our work would not have been possible without the support of the IEEE SIGHT staff lead and the team that works with her. I thank each and every one of you as well!

IEEE HAC & SIGHT First Call for Proposals 2019 Notice

The IEEE Humanitarian Activities Committee (HAC) provides multiple opportunities for

IEEE individuals and organizational units (OUs) to apply for and receive funding for projects, events, and conference participation support.

HAC will be updating its Calls for Proposals process in the first quarter (January - March) of 2019. Recognizing, however, that many activities take place early in the year and cannot wait for a later deadline, HAC will hold one call per program in January 2019 that utilizes the same format as the 2018 Call for Proposals.

Deadlines:

- Submission deadline for **HAC Projects Call 1** is 21 January 2019
- Submission deadline for **HAC Events Call 1** is 24 January 2019
- Submission deadline for **IEEE SIGHT Projects Call 1** is 28 January 2019
- Submission deadline for **HAC Conference Participation Call 1** is 31 January 2019

Please note, later in Q1 2019 HAC will be releasing a revised call with further deadlines for 2019. Information will be posted on hac.ieee.org.

IEEE SIGHT group project underway in Valparaíso, Chile

The SIGHT group of students from the Pontifical Catholic University of Valparaíso, Chile have come together to illuminate "Park 36" with sustainable solar energy. The space, which before was only an empty plot of land, was converted by the neighborhood into a children's playground and community garden as an attempt to discourage local delinquency. The only thing that was missing was the lighting.



The team conducted an electrical and financial study, and then began the first installation efforts on 1 December. IEEE SIGHT Ecuador organized its first workshop on 16 - 17 November in Quito on Management of Technological Projects with Social Impact. It was attended by 20 IEEE members and non-members from all over the country. Participants learned from invited speaker Santiago Cartagena, MBA, PMP, how to transform project proposals into concrete realities, achieving their goals with

the time and available resources provided. The event also included training on implementing sustainable humanitarian projects within working communities through concepts, case studies, tools and standards. IEEE HAC Workshop at R10 HTC 2018

From 6 - 8 December 2018, the Region 10 Humanitarian Technology Conference took place in Sri Lanka. The three-day conference's theme was "Sustainability for Humanity," and delegates from all over the Asia-Pacific area from Japan to Pakistan to New Zealand were in attendance. During the event, **IEEE Humanitarian Activities Committee (HAC)** Chair Paul Cunningham led a workshop on Technology and Innovation for the UN SDG, focusing on the role of engineering in development and providing examples of initiatives that contribute to various Sustainable Development Goals.

Changing Seasons of Leadership," drawing on his past experience as an HAC member and active SIGHT contributor.



Electrical Safety and Accident Prevention video

In 2016, IEEE SIGHT and IEEE Industry Applications Society (IAS) partnered to fund an **electrical safety and accident prevention video** made by a SIGHT group in Hyderabad, India. The team, led by Satish Chaparala, created the video to increase overhead power line safety awareness for government entities, electric utilities companies, and the general public.

Electrical safety awareness continues to be a pressing need in developing countries, so the IAS featured the project in their **Society December newsletter**. They will be including a short article on the topic in the March/April 2019 issue of IEEE IAS Magazine, and conducting an electrical safety awareness program at the upcoming PowerAfrica2019 conference.


2018 Year-End IEEE SIGHT Group survey

Responses will be used to streamline processes, strengthen communication, and expand IEEE SIGHT in 2019 - your participation is greatly appreciated!


2018 Webinars and Videos
